#### A Message from your SMART President

I scoured the internet, looking for a group to travel with. We had never been on a caravan before and knew nothing about them. Fantasy RV, Adventure Caravans, and other companies advertised trips, but they were so expensive. Then I happened upon SMART. Here was a group of fellow veterans to travel with, and at much lesser cost than the other guys. What a great find! We signed up and found ourselves 16th on the waiting list. The year passed and people dropped off the go-list and people entered from the wait-list. Soon, we were on! It proved to be the trip of a lifetime. We made lifelong friends on that caravan and discovered the joy of camping with fellow veterans.

The following year in 2016, we went on the Canadian Maritimes caravan offered by SMART. We had a great adventure and made more lifelong friends. We also went on two caravans with Escapees - one to the Rose Bowl Parade in Pasadena, California, and the other to the Balloon Fiesta in Albuquerque, New Mexico. While we enjoyed those events, we did not make any lasting friendships. There just wasn't that connection we experienced with SMART.

In 2017, SMART's National Muster took place in Rayne, Louisiana. Since we had family in Rayne, we decided to go to it. What makes the **Goldcoasters** a successful chapter? Planning, and thinking outside the box! Our December Muster was held at CB Smith County Park. We played Bean Bag Baseball and Card bingo outdoors. We enjoyed relaxing social hours and meals out in the cooler Florida weather.



We toured the Naval Air Station where George H.W. Bush was stationed! They had a unique device called a hedgehog; a multibarrel anti-submarine mortar launching weapon of British origin. The launched explosive ordinances only exploded if they hit a sub. Otherwise the ordinance could be recovered and redeployed!

We took the Carrie B paddle-wheeler tour of the intercoastal waterway featuring homes of the rich and famous. Originally the lots sold for \$6000 but todays lot retails for the low starting price of \$350,000 – 10 million dollars! Rose Kennedy, Johnny Weismiller, Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz,



Sonny and Cher, Gloria Vanderbilt, as well as founders of Wells Fargo, Radio Shack, Wendy's and Seagram's lived here. Miami Vice was filmed in a home here. Many original homes are being torn down to build large modern homes. As we trav-

eled the waterway, the USS Annapolis Nuclear powered attack submarine surfaced in the harbor! What a surprise! Or did Kathy Steinbauer plan for that? Needless to say, police boats turned all watercraft away from the sub.

We toured one of the oldest homes in the area - Stranahan House. It was the 1901 home of Fort Lauderdale pioneers Frank and Ivy Stranahan. It served as a trading post and later was converted into a residence for the Stranahan's making it the oldest surviving structure in Broward County. Frank traded with the Seminole Indians and was known as a fair businessman. Ivy taught the tribal children.

We toured the Flamingo Botanical Gardens established in 1927. They are home to 15 "Champion" trees - the largest trees of their species in Florida. Specialized areas included over 3,000 rare, exotic orchids, native plants and trees. The Gardens are a wildlife sanctuary - home to permanently injured Florida natives such as alligators, bobcats, eagles, otters, panthers, peacock, and of course, flamingos!

Coral Castle built by 26-year-old Edward Leedskalnin, an immigrant from Latvia whose fiancée rejected him just before their wedding! He spent 28+ years building this structure with coral he mined on site with primitive tools and pulleys. The stones weight keeps them together, connected with precision allowing no light to passes







through joints. Lastly. We enjoyed an airboat ride through the Everglades learning about the waterways and animals calling this home. We ended the day with an alligator show. All gators have been relocated from

ponds where they are a nuisance to pet owners.

Our muster ended with a cookout at the Steinbauers home Our next muster is right around the corner in January at Manatee Hammock County







Park, Titusville FL, can't wait!
